New Mexico Security Guard Licensing



The State of New Mexico licenses companies and employees who provide security services on a contract basis to other non-security companies or individual clients.

There are 120 licensed contract security companies in New Mexico. There are 1500 Level III firearm certified security officers registered in New Mexico.

As a contract security guard or company it is important to have and maintain the state licenses required under the law. The governing statute is NMSA 61-27B.

Operating illegally will lead to arrest, large fines, denial of workman's compensation, banishment from future legal license application.

Applicants must pass a background check, be of proper age, complete training and testing. For the firearms licenses a psychological test is required. There is a licensing fee as part of the application.

Types of Security Licenses

- Private Patrol Operator– Owner of a contract security company.
- Private Patrol Operations Manager– Manager of a security company branch.
- Level One Guard– basic guard duties
 - * Age required is 18 yrs.
- Level Two Guard– intermediate guard duties interacting with the public. Age required is 21 yrs.
 - *Communication skills, unarmed skills, handcuffing, baton and chemical agent certification
- Level Three Guard– handgun qualified. Age required is 21 yrs.

“In House” Security Application
